Anzac Day Monday, 25TH April 2022

Message from Alan's son Patrick Ray

My late father, Sgt Alan Ray, RAF Police, served on 459 Squadron in the Western Desert in 1942. He often spoke to me about it and I know he'd very much have liked to be remembered on your website among his comrades. I also have some photos of other Squadron members that he had in his album. Unfortunately, there aren't any captions but perhaps someone will recognise them and I'd like you to have their pictures.

I've attached a photo of Dad that would have been taken during his time on the squadron and some more where

he's with other members, perhaps of the Police section but he didn't caption any of the pictures. He had a couple of prints of the group picture that's in the photo stream on your website and I've marked the one who (I think!) is him. I've also attached a copy of * the Christmas 1942 Sergeants' Mess menu with his name and the signatures of other mess members on the back. There isn't any official paperwork in the album that dates from his time with 459 but there's an ID card from 1943 when he was serving with DAPM Levant Central with his service number on it.

Some more photos. Dad told me that he'd had a lot more, including shots of aircraft, that had been printed off by the squadron photographic section, but he'd destroyed them before he returned to the UK because he was worried, he'd get into trouble for infringing security regulations if they were found. I'm not 100% sure #14 belongs with his 459 Sqn photos but it does look as though it was taken in the desert (there are some other shots that look like Palestine to me) and that would be the only time he served there. <<

From Matt Duggan - My wife's great uncle (paternal grandfather's older brother) James Harding Taylor 421945, - was a member of the 454 Squadron. He appears to have been called Jimmy on the squadron.

From his service records he served with 454 squadron from May 1944 to March 1945 during the squadrons period in Italy. He was an Air Observer (Navigator). He enlisted for service on the 24/04/1942 and appears to be mustered in that role from the start, 1 ITS at Somers.

He underwent training at 1 AOS Cootamundra, 3 BAGS West Sale and 2 ANS at Nhill before posting to Canada and the 1 GRS course. He then spent a short period Great Britain before being posted to the Middle East. Family recollection is that he was a member of *Hume's crew. This is highly possible as a photo in Mark Lax's book "Alamein to the Alps" has a picture on page 143 that has Hume seated on a squadron truck enroute to the aircraft with what appears to Jimmy Taylor seated behind Hume (able to supply photos). At demobilisation he was recorded as Flying Officer, and entitled to the 1939-45 Star, Italy Star, War Medal and Service Medal. Sadly, Jimmy passed away in the early 1970's.
